The Hay Creek Valley Historical Association invites you to participate as a volunteer <u>INTERPRETER and</u> <u>DEMONSTRATOR</u> at the **49**<sup>th</sup> **annual celebration of the Hay Creek Festival!** This year's festivities will take place **September 5**<sup>th</sup> – **7**<sup>th</sup> **at Historic Joanna Furnace 3 miles north of Morgantown, PA.** This longstanding community event attracts 10,000 visitors each year and offers something for the entire family, including; early American and home crafts, antique cars & tractors, Civil War encampment, period musical entertainment, numerous children's hands-on activities and so much more. The eight restored iron furnace buildings will also be open during the three-day festival and offer special displays and interpretive presentations.

Please keep in mind there is NO CHARGE for you to participate in this area of our festival. HOWEVER; we do expect that you follow our Interpreter and demonstrator guidelines which includes demonstrating your craft to the public and keeping your booth pure to the time that you represent. This includes wearing the appropriate clothing in this area.

## HAY CREEK FESTIVAL EARLY AMERICAN CRAFTSMEN AND INTERPRETERS RULES

The following items are to be considered REQUIREMENTS AND NOT SUGGESTIONS for anyone invited to participate in the **Joanna Furnace Iron Works & Community** area of the Hay Creek Festival. Your signature on the registration form implies your understanding and compliance with these requirements set forth by the Hay Creek Valley Historical Association.

- There is no fee to participate in the Joanna Furnace Iron Works & Community section of the Hay Creek Festival. However, Vendors should consider a monetary donation after the event or donating an item to our annual festival raffle.
- All festival applicants will be juried. New applicants should email three photos of your craft and short bio to <u>info@haycreek.org</u>.
   NOTE: Pictures and bios may be used for Hay Creek Festival advertising. Returning vendors <u>do not</u> have to be re-juried; however, these participants do have to submit photos of new items in which they are selling.
- All vendors MUST DEMONSTRATE and INTERPRET a period craft and/or trade. Sales of items are permitted.
- Appropriate <u>PERIOD CLOTHING IS REQUIRED</u> by all participants, vendors and demonstrators alike. This requirement is designed to maintain the integrity and public appeal of recreating the early American life in the Hay Creek Valley from 1791 to 1898. Please contact Hay Creek for more information on acquiring appropriate clothing. You can also check with James Townsend & Sons for 18th century clothing and supplies. Website: <u>http://www.townsends.us/</u> or Phone: 1-800-338-1665 to request a catalog. Remember to always wear the clothing the way it was meant to be worn.
- NO ALUMINUM CHAIRS AND TABLES, RADIOS, IPHONES, PLASTIC BUCKETS OR ANY SUCH ITEM ARE PERMITTED IN THIS AREA. ALL ITEMS VISIBLE TO THE PUBLIC SHOULD BE IN CHARACTER WITH THE TIME PERIOD AND RELATE TO THE CRAFT FOR WHICH YOU WERE JURIED. (Keep your Dunkin Donuts coffee and water in a period cup please.) Interpreters should not be talking on the phone and/or texting while working at their demonstration area.
- Smoking is not permitted in the Joanna Furnace Iron Works & Community area.
- NO PETS of any type are allowed, with the exception of those animals specifically designated for exhibit and historic interpretation.
- Interpreters may erect a period fly (canvas canopy with wooden poles) over booth area. Pop-up craft tents with metal poles are not
  permitted in the Joanna Furnace Iron Works & Community area of the festival. Note: we allow these tents to not only to protect
  you and your items but also to allow our festival to continue in the event of light rain. Visitors who attend our festival and pay the
  admission price expect to see your booth at least partially open in the event of inclement weather. Please indicate on the
  registration if you do not have a tent and want to be placed under one of our sheltered areas/
- Festival hours: 10 am to 5 pm daily.
- Booth setup must be completed by 9:30 am each day. Booth setup can also take place on Thursday prior to the festival from 10 am to 6 pm.
- All vehicles **MUST** be removed from the exhibit area of the festival by 9:30 am each day and <u>parked in the Mule Stable field</u>. Due to the authentic nature of the Hay Creek Festival and for visitor safety, vehicles are not allowed on the festival grounds during the event hours. **Cars should not interfere with photo ops by the public**.
- Upon arrival to the festival please present event pass to gate attendants upon entering the site. Individuals without a pass will be required to pay the admission price upon entry to the festival. Event Passes and Map will be mailed to you in August.
- The Hay Creek Festival is a family-friendly event. We expect that participants maintain a positive atmosphere at our festival and greet each visitor, volunteer, and vendor in a professional manner.
- The Hay Creek Festival is an educational event that supports the mission of the Hay Creek Valley Historical Association and the
  restoration of the historic Joanna Furnace property. It is not our policy to offer financial compensation to demonstrators or
  interpreters to be a part of our fundraising event. We hope that your passion for your craft is what drives you to attend our festival
  and to teach your trade to the next generation.
